E-CIGARETTES & VAPORIZERS

THE REALITY & THE RISKS: SAFER DOES NOT MEAN SAFE

E-cigarette, or "e-cigs", use is growing, quickly outnumbering traditional forms of tobacco use

E-cigs look like regular cigarettes, while others look like pens, pipes, and USB flash drives. Also known as "vapes", "e-hookahs", "mods" and "vape pens"



VAPORIZERS & MARIJUANA

- Different types of smoking devices are on the market that allow the user to inhale the fumes or vapor from THC.
- Tetrahydrocannabinol or "THC", is the chemical in marijuana that makes the user feel "high."
- Vaporizers used to smoke marijuana concentrates, such as hash oil, or "wax" are identical to vaporizers used for tobacco products

ADDITIVES AND FLAVORS

- Research shows 31% of youth identify flavors such as mint, and fruit as a primary reason for ecigarette use.
- While some believe that e-cigarettes are safer than combustible cigarettes, the truth is that scientists are still learning about the long term health effects of e-cigarettes. Some ingredients in the aerosol can be harmful to the lungs.

A CALL TO ACTION:

- ✓ Talk to youth about the risks of e-cigarette use in young people
- ✓ Set a positive example by being tobacco-free
- ✓ Advocate for tobacco prevention education and restrictions on the sale of flavored products
- ✓ Support tobacco-free public space initiatives that include e-cigarettes in your local schools and parks
- ✓ Support local Tobacco-21 initiatives in your community, that will raise the minimum buying age for all tobacco products to 21 years old
