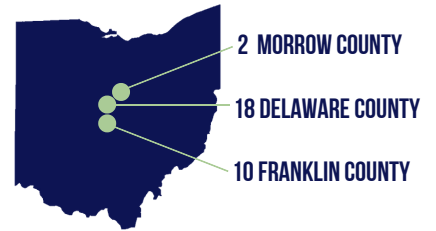

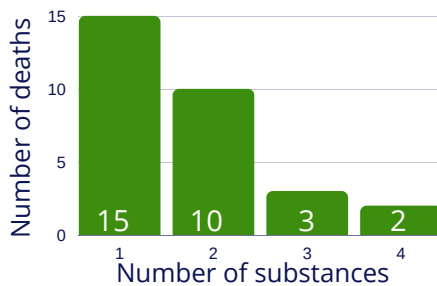

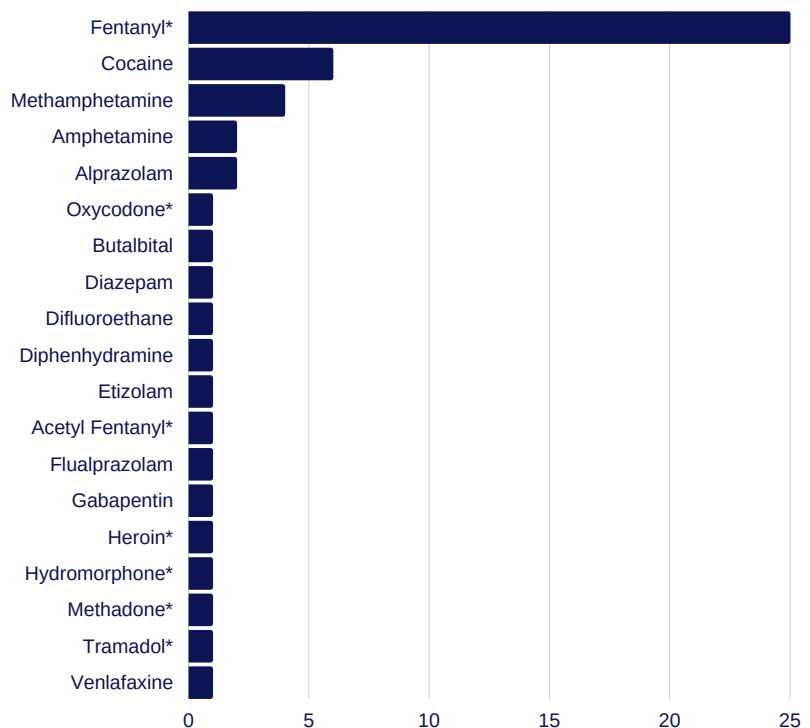

NUMBER OF SUBSTANCES INVOLVED IN FATAL OD



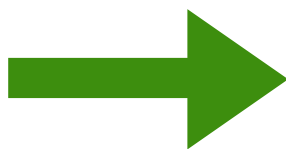
SUBSTANCES FOUND MOST FREQUENTLY IN THOSE THAT DIED OF AN OVERDOSE *Opioid

SUBSTANCES SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFIED IN 30/30 DEATHS

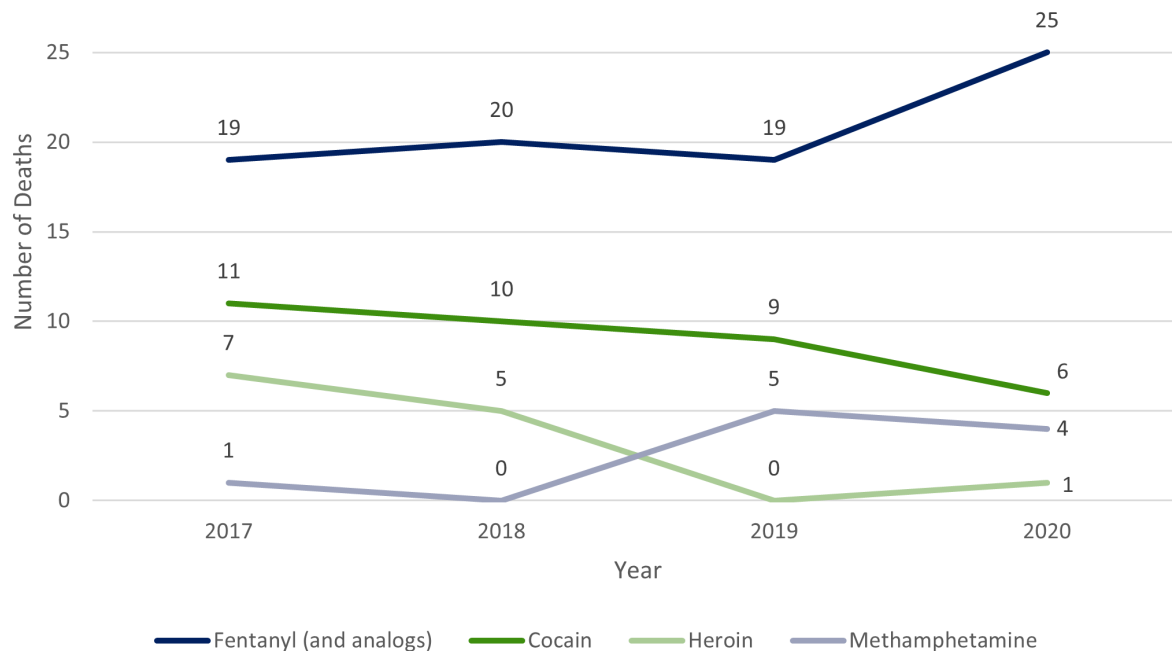

29/30 deaths involved an opiate

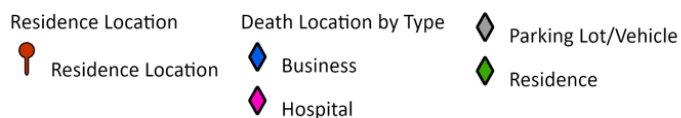
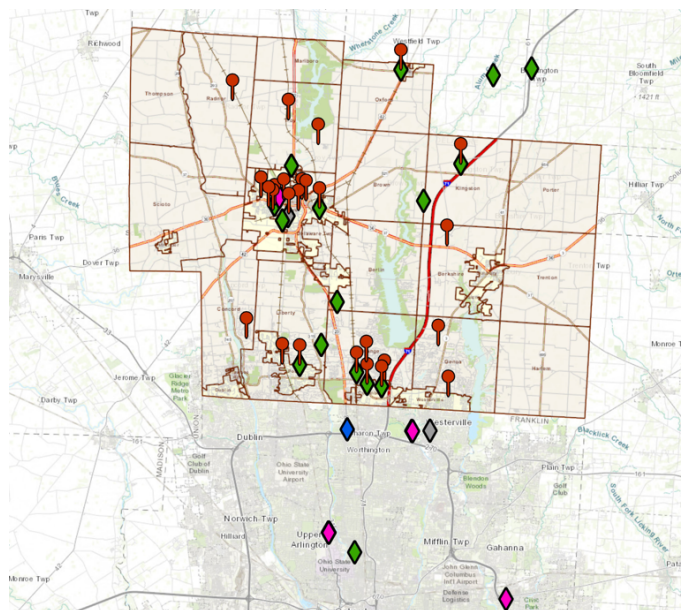

RESIDENCE INCLUDES: DECEDENT'S HOME, FRIEND'S HOME, HOUSE/APARTMENT

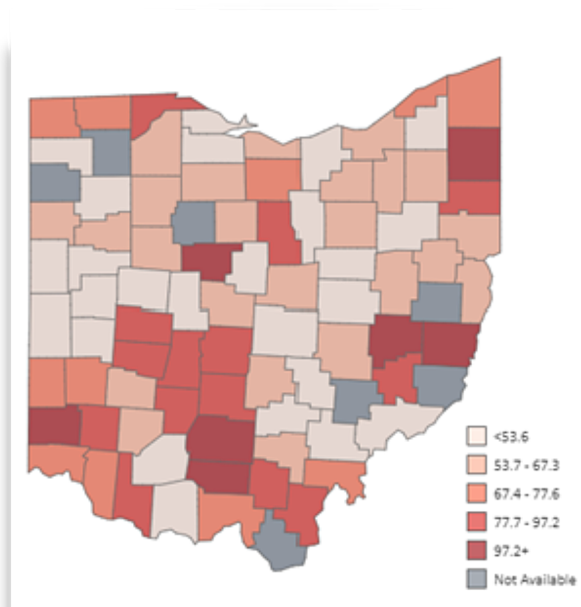

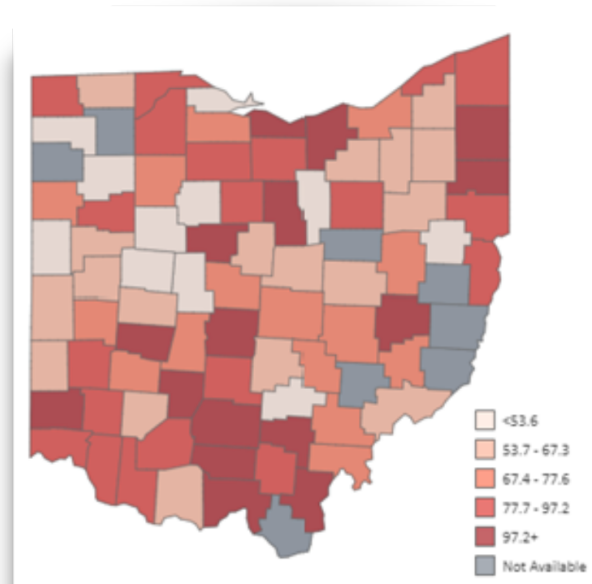
