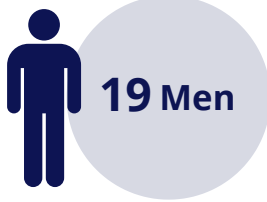

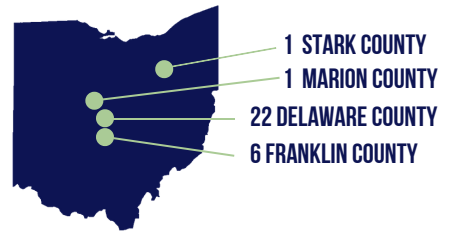

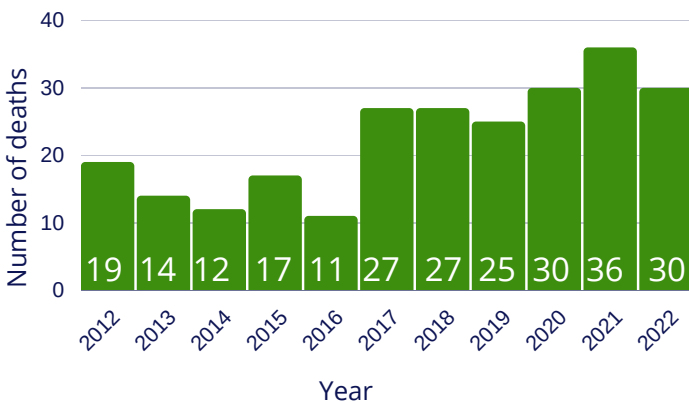


Overdose Prevention Tip:

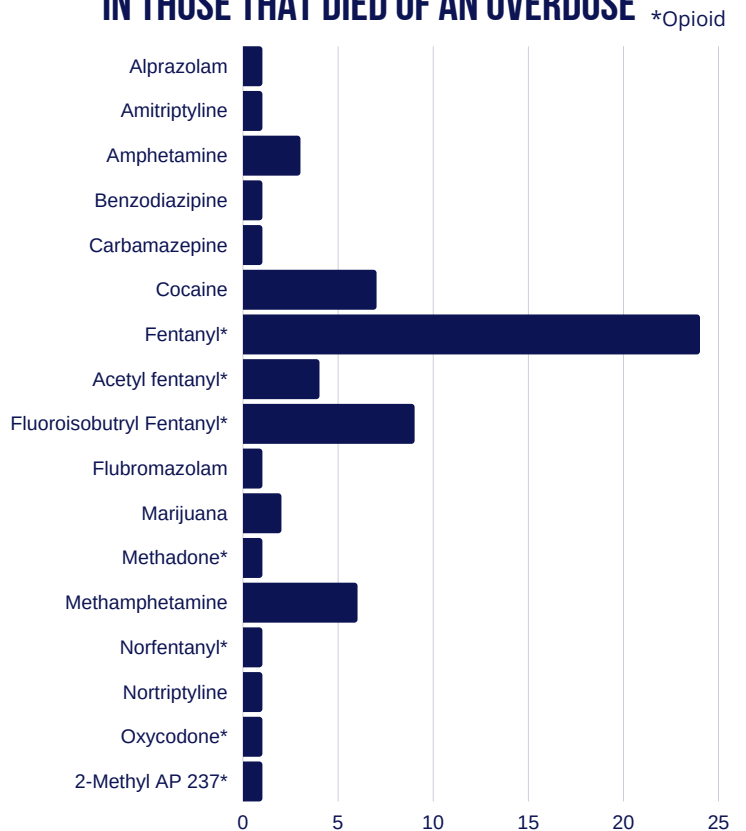
Mixing drugs increases the risk of a person overdosing. Use one drug at a time, or use less of each drug.

NUMBER OF RESIDENT DEATHS DUE TO OD

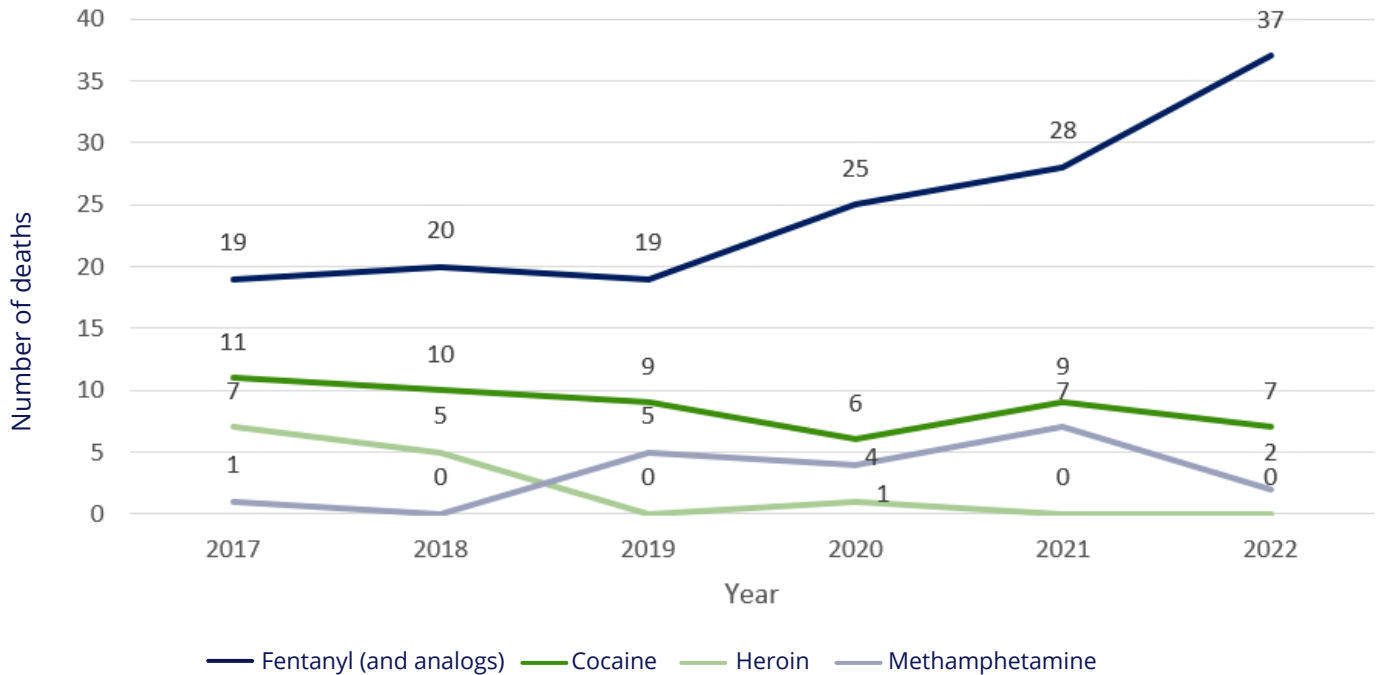


SUBSTANCES FOUND MOST FREQUENTLY IN THOSE THAT DIED OF AN OVERDOSE



- Specific drugs were identified in all 30 overdose deaths
- 22/30 overdoses included more than one drug
- 80% of the overdose deaths included fentanyl
- Delaware County has a 3.4% positivity rate for non-prescribed fentanyl when drug specimens are tested in a lab
- There were no xylazine overdose deaths recorded in the County in 2022

*Residence includes decedent's home, friend or partner's home, and house/apartment locations



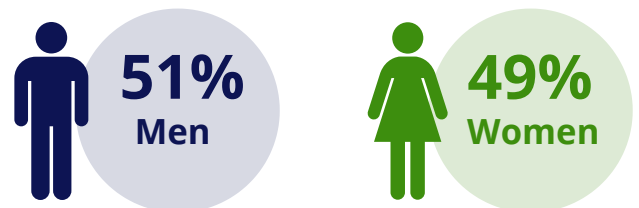
21/30 Overdose deaths occurred at a residence. Using opioids alone increases the risk of overdosing.

DELAWARE COUNTY EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR SUSPECTED DRUG OVERDOSE BY YEAR



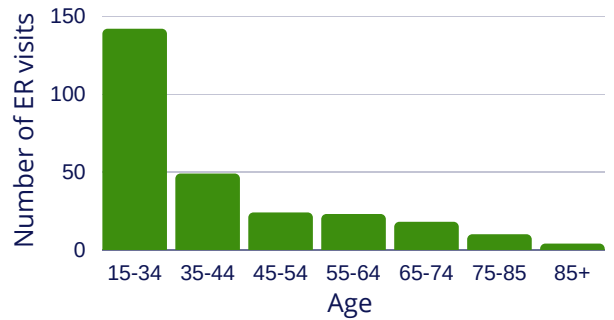
DELAWARE COUNTY EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR SUSPECTED DRUG OVERDOSE BY GENDER

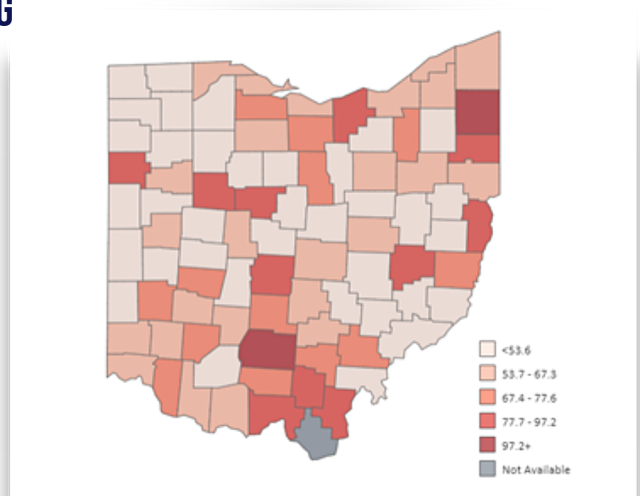
DELAWARE COUNTY EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR SUSPECTED DRUG OVERDOSE BY AGE GROUP

- The group with the highest amount of ER visits with suspected overdoses were individuals 15-34 years old.
- There was a total of 278 ER visits of Delaware County individuals for suspected drug overdose.
- 51% of ER visits were individuals aged 15-34 years old.
- 81% of individuals were white.

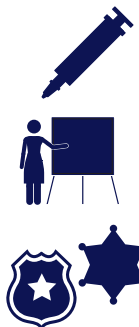


EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR SUSPECTED DRUG OVERDOSE RATES PER 10,000 VISITS IN 2022

IN 2022, THE DELAWARE PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICT:

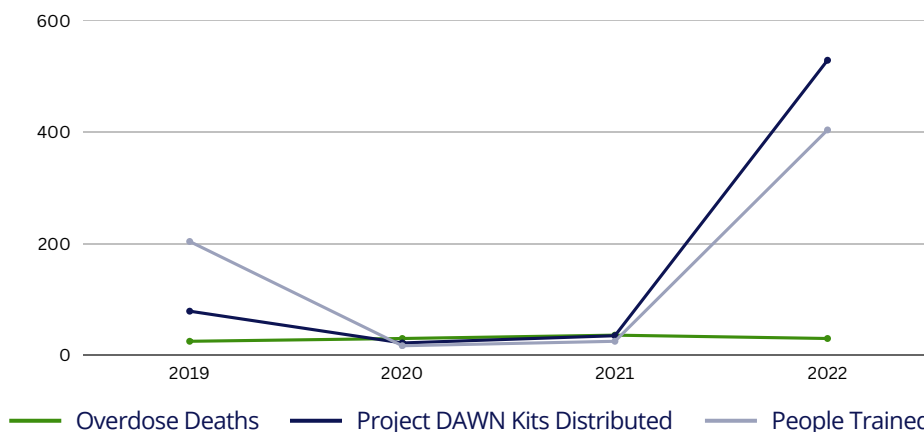


- DPHD distributed **529** individual Project DAWN kits.
- DPHD has trained **404** individuals in Project DAWN opioid education and naloxone distribution.
- DPHD has distributed **154** First Responders kits to Law Enforcement and security personnel in Delaware County.
- There were **17** overdose reversals by Delaware County First Responders in 2022.*



*This data was collected from Delaware County law enforcement offices. It does not include any overdose reversals that may have occurred from interventions outside of law enforcement.
