Bird Feeders

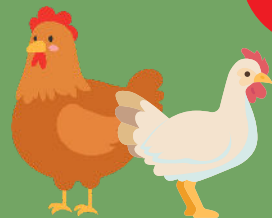
Many animals are attracted to bird feeders. Bring feeders in at night, offer only a day's worth of seed, and keep the ground clean.

Fruit Trees & Gardens

Fruit trees and gardens attract wildlife. Harvest ripe produce, remove fallen fruit, and use motion alarms or electric fencing to protect your crops.

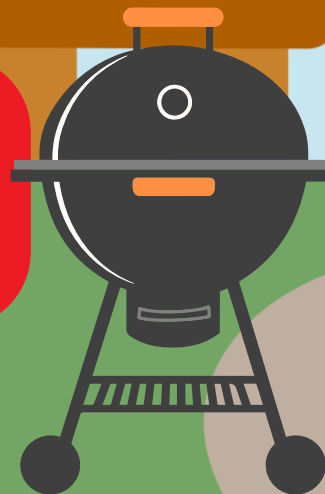
Livestock

Free-ranging pets and livestock attract wildlife. Keep them safe — especially at night — in secure outbuildings or fenced areas



Grills

Food smells on outdoor grills can attract wildlife. Clean up these areas or bring your grill into a shed or closed garage when not in use.



Crawlspace, Attics & Chimneys

Wildlife may seek shelter indoors. Be sure to patch exterior holes. Make sure all animals have left your home before securing entry.

Unsecured Garbage

Wildlife is attracted to garbage. Use wildlife-resistant garbage cans or modify existing cans. Or keep cans in a shed or garage until pickup.



Pet Food

Feed pets indoors. If feeding pets outside or on a porch, remove bowls after feeding. Secure pet food bags indoors.
